[IN 1902, ON THE TOWN SQUARE IN CLARINDA, IA, CAFÉ OWNER BERT GRAY EMPLOYED A CHEF FROM HOMBERG, GERMANY (WHERE THE IDEA OF GROUND MEAT ORIGINATED). THE CHEF CREATED A GROUND MEAT PATTY SANDWICH, HAVING THE BAKER DOWN THE STREET CREATE A BREAD TO FIT IT, WHICH BECAME THE BUN. THEY SERVED IT WITH PICKLES, ONIONS, KETCHUP, AND MUSTARD.]

We have now come full circle-back to the Bison, celebrating its return to Kansas.

BISON SLOPPY JOE (GROUND BISON MEAT WITH COHEN'S SAUCE) ON OUR WHEAT BUN, WITH YOUR CHOICE OF COLE SLAW, BAKED BEANS, OR CURLY OVEN FRIES ....... \$9.00 Cohen's sauce: Mr. and Mrs. Sammy Cohen had a café in Junction City from the early 1900s into the 1970s. We honor the Cohens and local history by having created a sauce as close to their famous BBQ sauce as we could.

#### UTOPIAN VEGETARIAN

IN 1856 A COLONY OF UTOPIAN VEGETARIANS SETTLED NEOSHO CITY, 3 MILES NORTH OF CHANUTE. THEY WERE THERE ABOUT A YEAR AND ENDED UP RETURNING BACK EAST, OR SETTLING AS INDIVIDUALS ELSEWHERE IN KANSAS. THE ONLY TRACES NOW LEFT ARE A CREEK NAMED VEGETARIAN CREEK, A CEMETERY, AND COMMENTS BY HISTORIANS.
