AMERICAN INDIAN

The Native Americans of the Great Plains had migrated here from the East. James Dorsey, who lived among them researching for the Smithsonian, referred to them as being Dhegiha Sioux people. This included the Osage, Kansas, Quapaw, Ponca and Omaha tribes. The Osage and Kansas or Kaw were the tribes that had occupied the territory that became the State of Kansas. Our state is named after the Kansas tribe, and they were the last to occupy the Council Grove area. These recipes are representative of the Plains Indians.

The only traces now left are a creek named Vegetarian creek, a cemetery, and comments by Historians.
